Thanks so much for your interest in **STUDIO CAMP** @ Arts & Ideas Sudbury School.



This summer we're running a **3-week session at the Arts & Ideas School June 29 – July 17 for 6 to 11 year olds.**

Studio Camp is a creative, workshop-based program where campers spend their days building, painting, cooking, designing, and making. Campers work together or solo in shared studio blocks, with room to follow their ideas and take their work in different directions.

Program Overview

Each day includes two studio blocks, along with time for lunch, an ongoing mural, outdoor play, and a weekly trip to the snowball stand.

Self-Portraits: Drawing & Paper Maché
Signs, Buttons, Zines: Say Something
Crazy Dances
Cosmetology and Characters
Cooking Lab: Made from Scratch

About Attending 1, 2, or all 3 weeks

- >Campers can sign up for any week.
- >Those attending all three weeks have more time to develop their work and follow ideas further. There is a discount for signing up for the 3 week session.
- >Campers joining for one or two weeks jump right in—starting something new or working alongside projects already in progress.

Staff

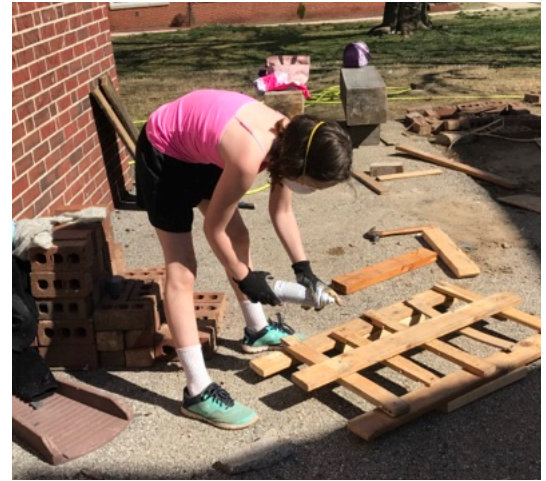

Joined by Anna Kroll, an accomplished visual and performing artist, and a small team of experienced staff and assistants, staff initiate the studio themes, support campers throughout the day, and enthusiastically act as artist-guides for ideas big and small.

While Arts & Ideas Sudbury School is our host, Studio Camp is a specialized program with a daily schedule and guided studio exploration. A respectful, collaborative approach to kids still leads the way, creating a space where they can settle in, make things, and be themselves. Opinions welcomed. No votes required. (Sudbury is a democratically run school model.)

The Space

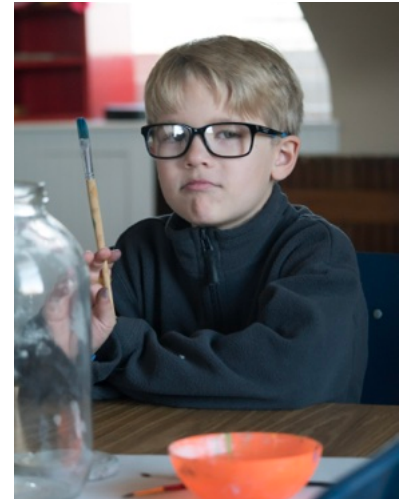
The Arts & Ideas campus is situated on an acre of land in beautiful Northeast Baltimore. There is a large all-purpose field for tag and other games; swings, tetherball, sports equipment and a basketball hoop. The outdoor space has lots of shade, fruit trees, and friendly chickens. Indoors has numerous resources for the creative in search of materials. In addition to plentiful art supplies, there are 3 large smart boards for drawing or planning out ideas. A commercial grade kitchen will delight any cook, and a stocked



cosmetology studio and wood shop will supply imaginations. There are additional resources for campers wishing to advance their ideas such as video cameras, laser printers and 3D printers which may be available as the 3 week campers look for ways to keep the creativity evolving.

2 in1

From July 6 through 17, the building will also host the Verenton Camp—an immersive business, finance and innovation camp for teens 15 - 18. While the two camps are separate, everyone will be creating + making. Lunchtime might include some all-ages games and fun. Staff are very familiar with managing the building with a full age range of young people.
